Sheep Herding Demonstration

Scottish sheep herding is a time-honored tradition deeply rooted in the rugged and picturesque landscapes of Scotland. The practice of tending to sheep, often in the vast and challenging terrain of the Highlands, has been integral to the country's agricultural heritage for centuries. Skilled shepherds, known for their intimate knowledge of the land and their flocks, have employed a variety of herding dogs, most notably the Border Collie, to assist in managing the sheep. Ian Caldicott and his team of Border Collies from Wolston Farm in Scio, Oregon will delight you with his demonstrations. The demonstrations include the dogs moving groups of sheep around obstacles directed with words and whistles from Ian. Amusing stories, funny dog antics and information about the history and use of herding dogs are all included in the show.
